FROM THE YOUVERSION READING PLAN "THE GENEROUS ENTREPRENEUR" BY KIM AVERY

Resources are scarce.

I think we all feel that to some extent. Each day, I'm keenly aware that I only have a limited supply of energy, money, knowledge, and time. Thus, as a business owner, I'm tempted to hold and hoard these resources closely because once they are gone . . . they are gone, never to return again.

Or are they?

Living in this fallen world, our natural tendency is to believe that being tight-fisted with our limited resources is the quickest way to make sure we never run out. We easily believe the lie that if someone else takes one piece of the pie, there's one fewer for us, as if God can only create one pie, and that's all there ever will be.

Thankfully, we have a God who doesn't need people to serve Him, to grovel, or to make sacrifices hoping He will bless the works of their hands.

Check out this brief description of our God from Psalm 36:5 in The Message: "God's love is meteoric, His loyalty astronomic, His purpose titanic, His verdicts oceanic."

He is so full, so vast that all that He is and has generously overflows on you, on me, and on His whole creation. Our vast and generous God didn't just create once and decide He was done creating. For His children, His lavish supply never ends.

So, in faith, He calls us to over-give, to be generous to others, living out our belief that God always has more. When working with a client, give what was promised and then give a little bit more. In conversation, lavish others with our full attention and then offer a few extra minutes. When providing a product, under-promise and over-deliver. When performing a service, go the extra mile.

In Luke 6:38, God tells us that when we, in faith, generously empty our hands, something amazing happens: "Give, and it will be given to you. Good measure, pressed down, shaken together, running over, will be put into your lap. For with the measure you use, it will be measured back to you."

God has been scandalously generous with you and me. Let's pray today and every day that He will give us the faith to do the same with everyone we meet.



MISSION PARTNER SPOTLIGHT: HOW YOUR GIFT SUPPORTS OTHER MINISTRIES

MADE IN HOPE currently reaches out to 52 women survivors of sex trafficking in two communities. They are also the moms of 75 children. As part of our She LEADS (Leadership Empowerment And Development) Program, we aim to develop the survivors in their God-given skills and talents, usher them into a deeper relationship with God, and hone their leadership capacities.

Last year, we selected five mom-survivors as Livelihood Trainees. Each training day starts with morning devotion, where we discussed about the Gospel reading. The rest of the time was spent on teaching them livelihood skills and conducting sessions on parenting, women's issues, basic facilitation skills and practical outworking of what they were learning by doing home visitations to their fellow survivors in their respective communities. Through these, they gradually learned about Jesus and His ministry, His character and His compassionate heart for the marginalized and oppressed, including women

Here's what one of the trainees wrote: "I never thought that I will have the kind of life that I have now. One year ago, I was so devastated—my relationship with my live-in partner was really messy; we quarreled a lot, my kids did not have food to eat, we were so poor. When I got involved with She WORKS as a trainee, my life began to have light. I could not explain it, but as I came to know God through our devotions and prayer, I learned that I can come to Him when I have problems.

"I also observed myself becoming more interested in God; before I used to shun things that have to do with the Bible or with God. But when I accepted Jesus as my Lord and Savior, my life gradually began to take shape. Now I dream of raising good and godly kids, and that they will finish their college degree. I have learned how to reach out to my fellow survivors; before I was just by myself and I cared less about other people. I just did what I wanted to do without caring about the harm that it will do to my family or to others. I thank God for changing my life for good."
