

LIVING OUT GENEROSITY (a testimony)

In spite of how COVID has affected our lives, many people continue to live generously because they have experienced God's generosity in their lives. Here's what a First Prez member (who asked to remain anonymous) shared with us recently:

As a retiree on a fixed income, I have not been impacted by the economic situation, at least not yet. I've continued my weekly Raise the Sails pledge to First Prez. I've gifted cash to a couple of younger (non-retired!) folks who were laid off to help them pay their rent. I've bought extra groceries to give to a neighbor, made more donations to the Hawaii Foodbank, Foodland's Meals of Aloha, and to the World Food Program. I've also donated to Farrington High School for their food giveaway to families of their high school students, and to families of students from elementary and middle schools that feed into Farrington.

Why did I do all these? I have a home, and enough to eat. So many others do not, more now than ever before. I am helping to do for them what I would want them to do for me, if I did not have money for housing or food. As the Bible says (this one's from Da Jesus Book, a Hawaii Pidgin version of the Bible): "So, wateva you guys like people do to you guys bumbye, make lidat to dem, same ting, now. Dis everyting dat God's Rules say in da Bible, an everyting dat God's talkas wen teach." (Matthew 7:1)

CHARITABLE GIVING BOOST IN 2020: DID YOU KNOW?

Because of provisions in the CARES Act, charitable giving in 2020 has some unusual enhanced benefits. Normally a giver is limited to 60% of his/her AGI (adjusted gross income) each year when making charitable contributions. However, due to recent legislation, for the year 2020 a giver can deduct up to 100% of his/her charitable contribution.* This is an incredible benefit that is particularly timely for many of us during Raise the Sails. SOME THINGS TO BE GRATEFUL FOR: COMPLETED CAMPUS PROJECTS THANKS TO YOUR GENEROSITY, WE'VE COMPLETED TWO PROJECTS SINCE OUR LAST NEWSLETTER IN APRIL 2020:

MULTICEPTOR REMEDIATION

The City and County of Honolulu required all owners of a multiceptor (a specific type of grease interceptor) to upgrade their systems, in order to comply with Environmental Protection Agency regulations. First Prez (along with various shopping centers, restaurants, and schools) was required to remove and replace its current waste water systems. This included tearing out some storage spaces downstairs and installing new pumps and tanks. We then had to run new piping from our kitchens to a new 2,000-gallon grease interceptor outside of the building. We're grateful to the Lord that despite

the challenges of the weather, **KITCHEN EXHAUST** working around campus events, and technical issues, the project has been completed on time and under budget.





We recently replaced one of three kitchen exhaust fans on our roof. These fans are critical to the operation of our revenue-generating kitchens upstairs and downstairs. We are grateful for how our Buildings and Grounds Team came up with a way to replace the fans using a long-reach crane, instead of a helicopter, which saved us thousands of dollars.



ONLINE CHURCH

As of this writing, our in-person Sunday worship services remain suspended, but we are working on the logistics of resuming tentatively later this year. However, we have given the go-ahead for smaller groups to begin meeting in person, if they feel safe to physically gather. More details at www.fpchawaii.org/reopening

- SUNDAY WORSHIP SERVICES: 8AM, 9:30AM, 11:11AM, and 4PM. Video sermons from previous Sundays also available on the website.
- **DIGITAL CONNECT GROUPS**: virtual small groups open to anyone who wants to discuss the sermon right after each Sunday worship service.
- KO'OLAU KIDS CHURCH: We post age-appropriate video teachings for preschoolers, grade schoolers, and pre-teens and activity sheets for parents to use with their kids
- YOUTH GROUPS: Middle schoolers and high schoolers meet online almost every day through Zoom video conferencing for activities.
- YOUNG ADULTS SMALL GROUP: Young adults gather Sundays at 12:30PM to discuss the Sunday sermon.
- MEN'S DISCIPLESHIP GROUP: Men of all ages meet online through video conferencing for prayer, friendship, support, and honest sharing of their lives. Thursdays 6PM.
- **SUPPORT GROUPS**: DivorceCare (for those divorced), GriefShare (for those grieving), Facing Cancer with Hope (for those with cancer).
- **HEAVEN**: An 8-week online study on what the Bible says about heaven. Ongoing on Wednesday nights till Aug 26 on Zoom at 7PM. Hosted by Vintage Ministry.
- ALPHA: A practical introduction to the Christian faith where attendees can discuss and ask questions without feeling judged. Aug 5-Oct 14
- **ROOTED**: A weekly small group experience to help you explore a deeper relationship with God and learn to live your unique purpose in life. Aug 6-Oct 25.
- **JUST SHOW UP**: An online weekly session where attendees read along and listen together to beautifully recorded readings of the Bible.
- DAILY DEVOTIONS: Thoughts and reflections written by the staff published weekdays on www.fpchawaii.org.

SERVING THROUGH THE COVID CRISIS

- Through your generosity, First Prez was able to give:
 - + \$5,000 to The Pantry, a project of Feeding Hawaii Together, to distribute food to families in need;
 - + \$5,000 to Agape International Missions (AIM) to support rescued women who were working in garment manufacturing facilities that are now closed due to COVID.
- Your generosity supports various mission partners, like Robert and Naomi Puyu of Youth with a Mission
 (YWAM) in Papua New Guinea. One of the things they're working on is a leadership academy and vocational
 school in the capital city Port Moresby, to which our church gave seed money.
- Your generosity also helped fund the construction of YWAM's Open Heaven Discipleship School in Bangladesh, and supported the staff there furloughed due to COVID19.
- In spite of the pandemic, we continue to support our full list of local and global mission partners.
- July 25 will mark the 10th year of our school-supplies drive called Waimanalo Back-2-School Outreach led by the Women's Ministry, benefiting the students of Waimanalo.
- We are forming teams who can help the houseless community in Waimanalo pack their belongings and store them in a safe place 48 hours before the anticipated arrival of a storm during this hurricane season.
