Hakuhia is the new First Prez ministry that will steward the land at Koʻolau that God has entrusted to us. At the heart of the Hakuhia ministry is a guiding vision to renew people and place through community. After months of prayerful discernment amongst our church leaders, and in discussions with 'aina-based practitioners and community partners, we are humbly moving forward to steward the land that God has put into our care in ways that are aligned to our church's vision to love God, love people, and reach the world for Jesus Christ. We will move in ways that will:

- Glorify God
- Serve the Community
- Practice Environmental Stewardship
- Learn from the Hawaiian Culture
- Be Financially Responsible

We are currently researching potential programming aligned to these objectives. They include things like sustainable agriculture; promotion of health and wellness by opening up hiking and biking trails; and providing spaces for camping and retreats. Environmental stewardship could include reforestation and native-tree planting, to natural climate solutions. While we invest in these possible areas, we are seeking opportunities to also promote education and workforce training in fields like conservation, agriculture, and food systems. These are a few examples.

Concurrently, there is already ministry happening on the land for evangelism and direct discipleship, like this February's young adults' weekend retreat entitled Shaped, where they had times of worship and fellowship amongst God's creation, and shaped a pohaku stone as an exercise paralleling our own spiritual formation as a disciple of Jesus.

There is still plenty of work ahead as Hakuhia evolves, and we will keep the congregation both informed and engaged throughout this process. We will soon have information on our website with more information. We ask for your prayers as we continue to hear from God and seek his vision for our land.








MEET KELLY

It was chosen after prayerful consideration, much research, consultation, and interviews with community leaders of Hawaiian ancestry. Hakuhia is not the name of the land, but rather the ministry of stewarding and nurturing the land that our generous God has entrusted to us.

Hakuhia is a combination of two Hawaiian words; HAKU, which has several meanings, but when the "H" is capitalized, it refers to The Lord; and HIA, which means desire or delight. So putting the two words together, we have Hakuhia, which means God's delight. I am grateful to Kiha Pimental, a pastor with the Foursquare denomination, for his guidance and wisdom as we considered the name for our new ministry. He said, "It is God's delight that you all heard His voice to develop His land. You all heard His call. It was Hakuhia, God's desire and delight, when you bought the land in 2006, and now it is coming more into fruition."



HEAR WHAT GOD HAS DONE THROUGH RAISE THE SAILS

TANZANIA and eSWATINI: FIRST PREZ IS THERE! a report from mission partner Heidi Lum, founder of Advocates for Africa's Children (AFAC)

First Prez provided seed money to Advocates for Africa's Children (AFAC) to get emergency food relief to homebound kids during the pandemic crises in Africa. The food distribution continues to devastated households in eSwatini (formerly Swaziland) affected by school closures and layoffs. In addition, AFAC started community farming projects in eSwatini and Tanzania that will make the communities less vulnerable to border closures and food distribution disruptions in the future. In fact, they started seven new projects in early January.

First Prez also gave funds for the construction of the school kitchen and dining hall in its new school called Lawrence Academy School in Tanzania in a village that has had no local access to education. The first classes opened in 2020 with eight students and ended with 20! In fact, the academy
