Hakuhia UPDATE

As we seek to learn about the 'aina, the Hakuhia Ministry has started to walk the paths with those who can teach us about this place. The Hakuhia Citizen Forestry meet-up is a way to get involved. Those of us who have gone through training get together regularly to measure the trees on our Ko'olau property. To see our progress, anyone can visit the Treeplotter Inventory, which is accessible to the public with no login required at https://pg-cloud.com/hawaii.

By measuring the large trees on our Koʻolau property, we capture eco benefits and an inventory of current trees. To date, we have plotted and taken measurements of 226 trees.

One of our tallest mango trees is 86 feet high. This particular mango tree prevents rainwater from running off into the ocean, and filters 15,324 gallons of it annually. It removes pollutants from the rainwater before it is fed to our aquifer (a body of saturated rock through which water can easily move). The mango tree's massive canopy stores 1,878 pounds of carbon, meaning it sequesters that much carbon that would otherwise contribute to global warming and dangerous climate change.

We have also conducted a botanical survey of plants on our 246 acres of land, and have discovered that we have 12 native species, including mamaki and koa. We have created maps that show the topography and elevation of the former golf course. And we've set up partnerships that will provide support in a network of local organizations called the Ko'olau Mountains Watershed Project.

MAKING CHARITABLE GIFTS FROM RETIREMENT ACCOUNTS

When we reach the age of 70 ½ we're required by the IRS to withdraw a certain amount of money from our retirement accounts each year. That amount is called required minimum distribution (RMD). RMD rules apply to tax-deferred retirement accounts: traditional IRAs, rollover IRAs, SIMPLE IRAs, SEP IRAs, most small-business accounts, and most 401(k) and 403(b) plans. One form of RMD is something called Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD), which can be a tax-efficient and convenient way to support First Prez's mission because you can donate directly from your retirement account to the church, which then reduces your tax liability. Contact your financial advisor to learn more about QCDs and how you can use it to help First Prez further its mission of "love God, love people, and reach the world for Jesus Christ."

First Prez member Richard Willoughby shares his experience with QCD: "When the Raise the Sails Generosity Journey started in the fall of 2019, my wife Linda and I started to pray about what God was calling us to do. We had always been



writing a monthly check to the church for the offering. Since we were over 70 ½ years old, we investigated options with our financial advisor about how to handle our required minimum distribution from our IRA. He suggested we consider Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD), which goes directly to the church. This is an easy and simple process to set up. It proved beneficial to the church and to us. And because of the timing, we were also able to give upfront our tithe to First Prez, giving the church the funds at the first of the year."
