Blessed to serve the Lord with you as we all fight the good fight!



WAYS TO GIVE

- 1 ONLINE through the website: www.fpchawaii. org/give or www. raisethesails.org/give where you can make a one-time gift or set up recurring gifts.
- 2 TEXT-TO-GIVE: Text "FPCHI" to 77977 and follow prompts
- 3 FIRST PREZ APP: Choose the GIVE button on the app and follow prompts. If you don't have the app, go to the App Store (for iPhones) or Google Play (for Android phones), search for "First Presbyterian Honolulu," then download it.
- 4 MAIL your check to the church. We can also send you pre-addressed, stamped envelopes that you can use to send in your gift. Call the church office (808.532.1111) to request for the envelopes.



MAKING CHARITABLE GIFTS FROM RETIREMENT ACCOUNTS

When we reach the age of 70 ½ we're required by the IRS to withdraw a certain amount of money from our retirement accounts each year. That amount is called required minimum distribution (RMD). RMD rules apply to tax-deferred retirement accounts: traditional IRAs, rollover IRAs, SIMPLE IRAs, SEP IRAs, most small-business accounts, and most 401(k) and 403(b) plans. One form of RMD is something called Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD), which can be a tax-efficient and convenient way to support First Prez's mission because you can donate directly from your retirement account to the church, which then reduces your tax liability. Contact your financial advisor to learn more about QCDs and how you can use it to help First Prez further its mission of "love God, love people, and reach the world for Jesus Christ."



First Prez member Richard Willoughby shares his experience with QCD:

"Last fall when the Raise the Sails Generosity Journey started, my wife Linda and I started to pray about what God was calling us to do. We had always been writing a monthly check to the church for the offering. Since we were over 70 ½ years old, we investigated options with our financial advisor about how to handle our required minimum distribution from our IRA. He suggested we consider Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD), which goes directly to the church. This is an easy and simple process to set up. It proved beneficial to the church and to us. And because of the timing, we were also able to give upfront our tithe to First Prez, giving the church the funds at the first of the year."

GOD IS GENEROUS THROUGH HIS PEOPLE!

It was March 15th, the first Sunday when we suspended all on-campus worship services as a precaution against the Coronavirus. We had informed the congregation by email two days prior. But on that Sunday, we had a handful of staff on campus to greet and inform people who might come because they didn't get the word. And sure enough a few dozen people came. One of them was a First Prez member who had walked in the rain from the parking lot to the building, and after being told that there was no service, he turned around to go back to his car. But before he could get there, he turned around and went back toward the building again in the rain. It turned out that he forgot to hand over to Pastor Tim the offering envelope he had with him. What a picture of commitment and generosity!

NEW SEWER SYSTEM INSTALLED

We all know how important a sewer system is for any house, establishment, or church like First Prez. A change in the City and County regulations for how wastewater is handled mandates that we



renovate our building kitchen and sanitary drainage system. As a result we had to replace our multiceptor with a conventional grease interceptor, a massive project that involved redoing pipes in the building and installing a huge tank under the driveway outside the cart barn on campus. - ONLINE KO'OLAU KIDS CHURCH: We post age-appropriate video teachings for preschoolers, grade schoolers, and pre-teens and activity sheets for parents to use with their kids at fpchawaii.org/koolau-kids
- ONLINE YOUTH GROUPS: Middle schoolers and high schoolers meet online through Zoom video conferencing for worship, Bible study, journaling, and even workouts! More info at fpchawaii.org
