



We want to grow our hearts in generosity by putting God and the gospel first. The kind of heart we are giving from is more important than what we are giving to. It is my prayer that as we go through this journey together, we will see God move in ways that would exceed our expectations and greatly boost our faith in Him.

The Bible describes the Holy Spirit as being like the wind (Acts 2:2), and wind of the Holy Spirit is blowing. It's time to catch the wind. Together. It's time to raise the sails!

DEFINING MOMENTS IN THE LIFE OF FIRST PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH















1959

Our church was founded at the YWCA on Richards Street in Honolulu with Pastors Bill Phifer and Philip Lee. Pastor Phifer served for 15 years. 1961

First Prez bought property on Keeaumoku Street, Honolulu. Total contributions raised was \$565,000, equivalent to \$5 million today. New sanctuary was completed in 1961.

1977

Pastor Bob Owens installed as senior pastor of the church and served for 16 years.

1994

Pastor Dan Chun installed as senior pastor of the church.

2002

First healing service held, marking a focus on the gifts of the Holy Spirit and healing prayer. 2006

First Prez purchased and moved to the Koʻolau campus.

2007

Partnership with Compassion International started and Compassion Wall installed. First Prez has sponsored more than 1,600 children to date.

2008

The 11:11 contemporary worship service started to reach out to young adults.

2010

The Alpha Course introduced at First Prez. More than 1000 have taken the course to date and many have been led to Jesus Christ.

2014

First Prez changes denomination from PCUSA to ECO (A Covenant Order of Evangelical Presbyterians). 2015

THE PRIMARY GOAL

100% ENGAGEMENT

We invite every person in the First Prez 'ohana to join this journey, take the next step in discipleship, and grow in generosity. As we understand God's generosity, our love for others grows, and so do our compassion, generosity, sense of mission, and the desire to share the Gospel. We find it easier to bless others. We become the church that looks to the interests of others more than ourselves.

THE SECONDARY GOAL

\$15.5 MILLION TOTAL

(inclusive of annual ministry operations for two years, repairs, and ministry expansion)

We're trusting God to move through us in investing \$15.5 million over the next two years to accomplish the vision He has given our church to impact these three areas:

MINISTRY OPERATIONS: \$9 MILLION

For current ministries and day-to-day operations of First Prez for the next two years. Our annual church budget is \$4.5M, multipled by two years, equals \$9M.

REPAIRS AND RENOVATIONS: \$5 MILLION

For needed repairs and improvements on campus (sewer system, fellowship hall, elevators, roofing, road paving, etc).

MINISTRY EXPANSION: \$1.5 MILLION

For expanding the reach of God's Kingdom locally and globally through new ministries, including The Vine satellite campus, staffing and training of new leaders.

WE PRAY FOR YOUR 100% PARTICIPATION AND PERSONAL ENGAGEMENT IN DISCERNING HOW GOD WOULD HAVE YOU GROW IN THE SEASON AHEAD.

COMMIT FULLY


Embark on a generosity journey with God, and encourage others to do the same.

Josh. 1:1 After the death of Moses the servant of the LORD, the LORD said to Joshua son of Nun, Moses' aide: 2 "Moses my servant is dead. Now then, you and all these people, get ready to cross the Jordan River into the land I am about to give to them—to the Israelites. 3 I will give you every place where you set your foot, as I promised Moses. 4 Your territory will extend from the desert to Lebanon, and from the great river, the Euphrates—all the Hittite country—to the Mediterranean Sea in the west. 5 No one will be able to stand against you all the days of your life. As I was with Moses, so I will be with you; I will never leave you nor forsake you. 6 Be strong and courageous, because you will lead these people to inherit the land I swore to their ancestors to give them.

Josh. 1:7 "Be strong and very courageous. Be careful to obey all the law my servant Moses gave you; do not turn from it to the right or to the left, that you may be successful wherever you go. 8 Keep this Book of the Law always on your lips; meditate on it day and night, so that you may be careful to do everything written in it. Then you will be prosperous and successful. 9 Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged, for the LORD your God will be with you wherever you go."

- Key Theme: Making Jesus your top priority will lead to your greatest adventure.

Josh. 2:1 Then Joshua son of Nun secretly sent two spies from Shittim. "Go, look over the land," he said, "especially Jericho." So they went and entered the house of a prostitute named Rahab and stayed there.

Josh. 2:2 The king of Jericho was told, "Look! Some of the Israelites have come here tonight to spy out the land." 3 So the king of Jericho sent this message to Rahab: "Bring out the men who came to you and entered your house, because they have come to spy out the whole land."

Josh. 2:4 But the woman had taken the two men and hidden them. She said, "Yes, the men came to me, but I did not know where they had come from. 5 At dusk, when it was time to close the city gate, they left. I don't know which way they went. Go after them quickly. You may catch up with them." 6 (But she had taken them up to the roof and hidden them under the stalks of flax she had laid out on the roof.) 7 So the men set out in pursuit of the spies on the road that leads to the fords of the Jordan, and as soon as the pursuers had gone out, the gate was shut.

Josh. 2:8 Before the spies lay down for the night, she went up on the roof 9 and said to them, "I know that the LORD has given this land to you and that a great fear of you has fallen on us, so that all who live in this country are melting in fear because of you. 10 We have heard how the LORD dried up the water of the Red Sea for you when you came out of Egypt, and what you did to Sihon and Og, the two kings of the Amorites east of the Jordan, whom you completely destroyed. 11 When we heard of it, our hearts melted in fear and everyone's courage failed because of you, for the LORD your God is God in heaven above and on the earth below.

Josh. 2:12 "Now then, please swear to me by the LORD that you will show kindness to my family, because I have shown kindness to you. Give me a sure sign 13 that you will spare the lives of my father and mother, my brothers and sisters, and all who belong to them—and that you will save us from death."

Josh. 2:14 "Our lives for your lives!" the men assured her. "If you don't tell what we are doing, we will treat you kindly and faithfully when the LORD gives us the land."

Josh. 2:15 So she let them down by a rope through the window, for the house she lived in was part of the city wall. 16 She said to them, "Go to the hills so the pursuers will not find you. Hide yourselves there three days until they return, and then go on your way."

Josh. 2:17 Now the men had said to her, "This oath you made us swear will not be binding on us 18 unless, when we enter the land, you have tied this scarlet cord in the window through which you let us down, and unless you have brought your father and mother, your brothers and all your family into your house. 19 If any of them go outside your house into the street, their blood will be on their own heads; we will not be responsible. As for those who are in the house with you, their blood will be on our head if a hand is laid on them. 20 But if you tell what we are doing, we will be released from the oath you made us swear."

Josh. 2:21 "Agreed," she replied. "Let it be as you say." So she sent them away, and they departed. And she tied the scarlet cord in the window.

Josh. 2:22 When they left, they went into the hills and stayed there three days, until the pursuers had searched all along the road and returned without finding them. 23 Then the two men started back. They went down out of the hills, forded the river and came to Joshua son of Nun and told him everything that had happened to them. 24 They said to Joshua, "The LORD has surely given the whole land into our hands; all the people are melting in fear because of us."

- Key Verse: As soon as the priests who carry the ark of the LORD –
 the Lord of all the earth set foot in the Jordan, its waters flowing
 downstream will be cut off and stand up in a heap." Joshua 3:13
- Key Theme: Faith is about action and not just about what we mentally assent to.

Josh. 3:1 Early in the morning Joshua and all the Israelites set out from Shittim and went to the Jordan, where they camped before crossing over. 2 After three days the officers went throughout the camp, 3 giving orders to the people: "When you see the ark of the covenant of the LORD your God, and the Levitical priests carrying it, you are to move out from your positions and follow it. 4 Then you will know which way to go, since you have never been this way before. But keep a distance of about two thousand cubits between you and the ark; do not go near it."

Josh. 3:5 Joshua told the people, "Consecrate yourselves, for tomorrow the LORD will do amazing things among you."

Josh. 3:6 Joshua said to the priests, "Take up the ark of the covenant and pass on ahead of the people." So they took it up and went ahead of them.

Josh. 3:7 And the LORD said to Joshua, "Today I will begin to exalt you in the eyes of all Israel, so they may know that I am with you as I was with Moses. 8 Tell the priests who carry the ark of the covenant: 'When you reach the edge of the Jordan's waters, go and stand in the river.'"

Josh. 3:9 Joshua said to the Israelites, "Come here and listen to the words of the LORD your God. 10 This is how you will know that the living God is among you and that he will certainly drive out before you the Canaanites, Hittites, Hivites, Perizzites, Girgashites, Amorites and Jebusites. 11 See, the ark of the covenant of the Lord of all the earth will go into the Jordan ahead of you. 12 Now then, choose twelve men from the tribes of Israel, one from each tribe. 13 And as soon as the priests who carry the ark of the LORD—the Lord of all the earth—set foot in the Jordan, its waters flowing downstream will be cut off and stand up in a heap."

Josh. 3:14 So when the people broke camp to cross the Jordan, the priests carrying the ark of the covenant went ahead of them. 15 Now the Jordan is at flood stage all during harvest. Yet as soon as the priests who carried the ark reached the Jordan and their feet touched the water's edge, 16 the water from upstream stopped flowing. It piled up in a heap a great distance away, at a town called Adam in the vicinity of Zarethan, while the water flowing down to the Sea of the Arabah (that is, the Dead Sea) was completely cut off. So the people crossed over opposite Jericho. 17 The priests who carried the ark of the covenant of the LORD stopped in the middle of the Jordan and stood on dry ground, while all Israel passed by until the whole nation had completed the crossing on dry ground.

Josh. 4:1 When the whole nation had finished crossing the Jordan, the LORD said to Joshua, 2 "Choose twelve men from among the people, one from each tribe, 3 and tell them to take up twelve stones from the middle of the Jordan, from right where the priests are standing, and carry them over with you and put them down at the place where you stay tonight."

Josh. 4:4 So Joshua called together the twelve men he had appointed from the Israelites, one from each tribe, 5 and said to them, "Go over before the ark of the LORD your God into the middle of the Jordan. Each of you is to take up a stone on his shoulder, according to the number of the tribes of the Israelites, 6 to serve as a sign among you. In the future, when your children ask you, 'What do these stones mean?' 7 tell them that the flow of the Jordan was cut off before the ark of the covenant of the LORD. When it crossed the Jordan, the waters of the Jordan were cut off. These stones are to be a memorial to the people of Israel forever."

Josh. 4:8 So the Israelites did as Joshua commanded them. They took twelve stones from the middle of the Jordan, according to the number of the tribes of the Israelites, as the LORD had told Joshua; and they carried them over with them to their camp, where they put them down. 9 Joshua

set up the twelve stones that had been in the middle of the Jordan at the spot where the priests who carried the ark of the covenant had stood. And they are there to this day.

Josh. 4:10 Now the priests who carried the ark remained standing in the middle of the Jordan until everything the LORD had commanded Joshua was done by the people, just as Moses had directed Joshua. The people hurried over, 11 and as soon as all of them had crossed, the ark of the LORD and the priests came to the other side while the people watched. 12 The men of Reuben, Gad and the half—tribe of Manasseh crossed over, ready for battle, in front of the Israelites, as Moses had directed them. 13 About forty thousand armed for battle crossed over before the LORD to the plains of Jericho for war.

Josh. 4:14 That day the LORD exalted Joshua in the sight of all Israel; and they stood in awe of him all the days of his life, just as they had stood in awe of Moses.

Josh. 4:15 Then the LORD said to Joshua, 16 "Command the priests carrying the ark of the covenant law to come up out of the Jordan."

Josh. 4:17 So Joshua commanded the priests, "Come up out of the Jordan."

Josh. 4:18 And the priests came up out of the river carrying the ark of the covenant of the LORD. No sooner had they set their feet on the dry ground than the waters of the Jordan returned to their place and ran at flood stage as before.

Josh. 4:19 On the tenth day of the first month the people went up from the Jordan and camped at Gilgal on the eastern border of Jericho. 20 And Joshua set up at Gilgal the twelve stones they had taken out of the Jordan. 21 He said to the Israelites, "In the future when your descendants ask their parents, 'What do these stones mean?' 22 tell them, 'Israel crossed the Jordan on dry ground.' 23 For the LORD your God dried up the Jordan before you until you had crossed over. FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

WHAT ARE YOU ASKING ME TO DO?

First and foremost, we are asking that you pray and seek God's leading on what He is asking of you. Prepare your heart to hear Him, and then listen to what He says. Commit to attending all six weeks of the RAISE THE SAILS sermon series. Participate in a special six-week small group study. Engage in personal reflection with God in this RAISE THE SAILS Navigation Guide. Talk with your spouse, your family, or others about what this commitment will mean for this next exciting season of your life.

We are asking that you make a sacrificial commitment to Gospel-centered generosity whatever it is that God leads you to do.

Please mark your calendar for Commitment Sunday, November 10, 2019, when we will turn in our commitment cards in response to God's generosity in our lives.

HOW MUCH ARE WE AIMING TO RAISE? AND WHY DO WE NEED IT?

We are trusting God to move through us in investing a total of \$15.5 million from **December 2019 to December 2021**. The money we raise will impact three areas:

MINISTRY OPERATIONS: \$9 million will be for current First Prez ministries and day-to-day operations. Our annual budget is \$4.5 million, multiplied by 2 years, equals \$9 million: This includes Worship, Programs, Outreach, Campus, and Administration.

REPAIRS AND RENOVATIONS: \$5 million for repairs and improvements at our Koʻolau campus. Our Koʻolau campus was constructed in 1992.

Recently, a member of our Buildings and Grounds Team stated, "We're approaching the end of life of every major system on campus."

The three biggest items for repair are:

- Roof: approximately \$1 million to repair our roof. We currently have leaks
 in the sanctuary, office and children's ministry.
- Sewer System: approximately \$1 million. The City and County is requiring
 us to decommission our existing multiceptor system and install and
 retrofit a different sewer system.
- Parking Lot Paving: Approximately \$1 million to repave our driveway and parking lot.

Additional projects to be addressed with the funds include elevator repair, renovation of the sound and lighting systems in the Fellowship Hall, and capital improvements over the next few years.

MINISTRY EXPANSION: \$1.5 million will go to expanding the reach of God's Kingdom locally and globally through new ministries, including The Vine downtown campus, marketplace ministries, staffing, and training of new leaders and interns.

ANOTHER FUNDRAISING APPEAL? HAVEN'T WE DONE A BUNCH OF THESE RECENTLY?

Yes, we have. Thank you for your incredible generosity. In recent years, we've made a number of requests: \$316,000 for the fee to change denominations in 2014; \$1.8 million to retire the remaining balance of our loan on the 10th anniversary of our move to Koʻolau in 2016; \$547,000 to launch The Vine campus in 2018; and the annual request to address the operating deficit. We made the decision during each of those appeals to ask for just the specific amount needed to accomplish the specific goal. For each of those appeals, we considered rolling those requests into a larger multi-million dollar campaign, but decided against it. The result was more frequent, smaller appeals instead of one larger campaign spread out over

a longer period. We had previously conducted longer, larger, multiyear campaigns in 2000, 2005, and 2011. We are now embarking on a larger, multi-year journey, that includes all funding needs for the next few years: special projects, repairs and renovation, and our regular annual operating budget.

WHO MADE THE DECISION TO EMBARK ON THIS GENEROSITY JOURNEY AT THIS TIME?

As Presbyterians, all decisions are made and approved by our Session (our volunteer Board of Directors), in consultation with the Holy Spirit, other volunteer teams and the staff. Our Session, Finance Team, Buildings and Grounds Team, and staff all prayerfully considered and agreed with the necessity to launch RAISE THE SAILS at this time.

IF I AM COMMITTING TO RAISE THE SAILS, HOW DOES THIS CHANGE MY GIVING TO THE OPERATING FUND, OR MISSIONS, OR OTHER SPECIAL OFFERINGS?

During this two-year period, every contribution to God through First Prez is a contribution to our RAISE THE SAILS generosity journey. Every aspect of the ministry vision that God is calling us towards for the next two years will be funded through RAISE THE SAILS. There will not be separate funds. Therefore, every weekend becomes a day to celebrate and contribute towards what God is doing in us and through us as we move God's mission forward here at First Prez and beyond.

ARE THERE ADDITIONAL WAYS BESIDES CASH THAT I CAN GIVE TOWARDS RAISE THE SAILS?

Be creative as you explore ways you and your family can give towards RAISE THE SAILS. You might have stocks, property, or other items of that nature. Or you may have other stored resources that God has blessed you with in the past that He might be calling you to donate. In a past campaign, a generous donor sold his motorcycle and gave the proceeds to the church. Please let us know if you need assistance with facilitating gifts of property or stock, and we would be happy to help you with that. You can

HOW LONG IS MY COMMITMENT?

We are asking that everyone make a two-year commitment.

We'll accept commitment cards at all three worship services on Sunday, November 10, 2019. We are asking that everyone make a two-year commitment. The fulfillment period, or the time that we will actually be collecting your donations, will begin on Sunday, December 1, 2019 and will continue through December 31, 2021. You will have that entire two-year period to give to Raise the Sails. All donations given between December 1, 2019 and December 31, 2021 will go towards Raise the Sails.

WHAT IF I HAVE NEVER GIVEN TO FIRST PREZ BEFORE?

RAISE THE SAILS was developed specifically with you in mind. RAISE THE SAILS is a "one fund" generosity initiative, meaning that it is different from a traditional capital campaign where you are called to give an extra gift above and beyond your normal giving thus creating two steps for people who are not yet giving. RAISE THE SAILS is a call to sacrificial, Gospel-centered generosity for absolutely everyone at First Prez, members and attendees. If you have never given before, this is your chance to get in the game with a committed sacrifice. We really hope you will.

WHAT IF I AM NEW AROUND HERE?

RAISE THE SAILS is about the vision for our church and our personal discipleship in giving as followers of Jesus. We believe that the local church is one of the most compelling missions to give towards, and we would really love for you to make First Prez your home church and join us in RAISE THE SAILS. WHY IS THERE ONE FUND? WE HAVE NEVER DONE IT THAT WAY BEFORE.

We're collecting for one fund over two years to honor and appreciate all the gifts from the congregation, including people's regular tithes and offerings.

ONE FUND means we celebrate both your regular giving, and celebrate additional generosity through increased tithes or additional one-time gifts.

As a leadership, we've decided that for the next two years, our total generosity at First Prez will be going to one fund. Raise the Sails will extend from December 1, 2019 through December 31, 2021. In those two years, every gift made to First Prez will go to Raise the Sails to help us raise our sails and be filled with the Holy Spirit's power and purpose.

WHY DOESN'T KO'OLAU BALLROOM OR KO'OLAU GOLF PAY FOR THE BUILDING REPAIRS?

First Prez owns our 246-acre campus, and shares it with Koʻolau Ballrooms, our wholly-owned subsidiary, and Koʻolau Golf, our tenant. As the landowner and landlord, we are ultimately responsible for the capital repairs and improvements. Koʻolau Ballrooms and Koʻolau Golf contribute significantly to the cost of maintaining the facility and the grounds, by offsetting hundreds of thousands of dollars worth of expenses, like property tax, landscaping, utilities, room set-up and custodial and maintenance.
